COVID -19. The Hazard

Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that cause illness ranging from the common cold to more severe diseases such as MERS –CoV and SARS (CoV). The official name for this new disease, not previously seen in humans, is COVID – 19. On March the 11th the World Health Organisation, (WHO) categorised it as a Pandemic, which in WHO terms is the world wide spread of a disease.

This risk assessment recognises the virus as a Hazard and the transmission of the virus through minute water droplets that are expelled when coughing, sneezing, talking and breathing and through contact by hand with surfaces that have been contaminated.

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Symptoms – There are numerous symptoms of COVID-19, however research indicates that the following symptoms are present in over 95% of cases

- A new and continuous cough
- A high Temperature
- A loss of or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (Anosmia)

- 4. 5 Ensure sufficient suppliers of Sanitizer for dispensers and sanitizing wipes. Complete 20/7/2020
- 5. Additional cleaning measures to be implemented. (Daily all desks, communal surfaces and touchpoints) In Place
- 6. Remove all display and exhibition type materials from classrooms and breakout areas Complete
- 7. How to manage food and refreshments, (Prepacked food, airline style drinks cups etc.) Where will they eat? Complete20/7/2020
- 8. Breakout area seats may need removing or to be marked as out of use Complete 20/7/2020



- 9. Restrict access to Delegates only to smoking area (Or Ban Smoking)New smoking area being set up near bistro
- 10. Review numbers for boiler house tours and practical areas. Mark up for social distancing Complete 20/7/2020
- 11. Cleaning of surfaces and tools in practical area. How to ensure tools are not shared Complete 20/7/2020

Amendment Actions

- At Training Centre Segregation of delegates on different courses -wef 5/10/2020
- Toilets- Separate toilets so that different courses use different toilets-2/10/2020
